# **Student Wellbeing Policy**



## Rationale

Strategy – Key Elements

It is important for all children to establish meaningful relationships with peers, class teacher, other students and staff. In the school's daily life, the ways in which people interact with each other impacts significantly on each person's sense of self-worth, belonging and wellbeing.

The fostering of high quality, positive interpersonal relationships among staff, students, and parents is a responsibility shared by everyone.

To develop and sustain a motivated learning community where students experience success on a regular basis, expectations for students need to be clearly defined and consistently adhered to.
