Whole School Approach to Positive Behaviour Support

This year we are continuing to have a whole school approach to positive behaviour. Last year we implemented this approach and found it to be very successful. WSAPBS is a consistent approach across the school and all staff and all students know and act upon our rules and expectations. These are:

- Respect for self
- Respect for others
- Responsibility for all your actions

The 3 Rs are explicitly taught in each classroom and Specialist lessons. The children gain an understanding of what they mean and what is expected of them. All teachers and staff will have the same expectations and the same consequences if these expectations are not met. Visiting teachers also follow our approach. Being consistent helps the children to know what is expected of them. This is helping our school to be a calm place of learning.





FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2019, you do not need to complete an application form in 2020 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.


You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply in 2019.
 changed family circumstances; such as a
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.

Check with the school office if you are unsure







Absence Reminder: If your child is absent from school, you must advise the school as soon as possible on the day. Due to new legislation, the school is required to contact parents/guardians if your child is absent with an unknown reason. A Skoolbag App absentee form is the most efficient contact method or you can phone the school office and then provide a written note.




