LENT 2020

Lent commences on Ash Wednesday and continues until Holy Week. On Ash Wednesday we receive the mark of the ashes (the blessed and burnt palms from the previous Palm Sunday). They are a symbol of repentance and are placed on the forehead of Catholics around the world. They are a physical sign that Lent has begun. Ash Wednesday is a day of abstinence (going without meat) and fasting. Lent is a

time to rediscover the meaning of life and prioritise what is important in how we live our lives. We try to simplify our lives (fasting), take time out to reflect and pray (prayer), and listen and respond to those in need (almsgiving). 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Chinese New Year

NĚHĂO!! 歡迎 Huān yíng 2020.....

Huān yíng.. Welcome to 2020!!

It has been wonderful to see the students settle into the start of a new school year. Already this term, most students have retained their knowledge of Chinese and have engaged in Mandarin conversation even after the holidays!

We began our first lessons with students 'zooming' to China to meet their new teacher via video conference.

Streaming live meant that students were able to see where their teacher lived in real time. Some students saw that it was snowing outside their teachers window, or they lived in tall apartment buildings.

Our Chinese teachers have already started introducing new Mandarin vocabulary suited to each year level and to ensure continued space practice, revised vocabulary and tones from 2019.

The main aim for each Mandarin session will be:

- to introduce new vocabulary via video conferencing (25mins zoom)
- revise learnt vocabulary through games, written activities and movement
- focus on pronunciation and tone
- immerse and encourage students to be apart of Mandarin conversation
- to read Chinese Pinyin and incorporate the four tones of Mandarin
- Identify Chinese cultural festivities and customs, and relate them to Australian traditions



Our first introduction to Mandarin was learning about the most important Chinese FestivalChinese New Year! This year, it began on Saturday 25th January and went for 15 days.

Chinese New Year is a time to welcome in the new year with well wishes and participate in activities such as, dragon dancing, wearing new clothes (especially red), the giving of red packets with money (Hóngbāo), setting off fireworks and spending time with loved ones! To signify Chinese New Year and the Year of the Rat, the Year 6 students are currently in the process of constructing agamographs. These art pieces show a rat from one angle and from another angle, the Chinese character for rat.



Vocabulary

- Year Four and Five classes are focusing on colours through games and conversation:

Red: hóng sè	Yellow: huáng sè
Blue: lán sè	White: bái sè

Black: hēi sè

- Year One, Two and Three classes are learning varying degrees of how to introduce themselves and knowing basic verbs:

nǐ jiào shénme míngzi? (you called what name?)

wǒ jiào... (I am called...)

tā jiào shénme míngzi? (he/she called what name?)

tā jiào... (he/she called..)

Tíng (stop), zǒu (go)

- Foundation classes are currently exploring

the country of China and learning how to say:

hello (nǐ hǎo) and goodbye (zài jiàn).
