

Strong families give children a safe, secure place to be themselves and learn about who they are. Because children in strong families feel secure and loved, they have confidence to explore their world, try new things and learn. And they can deal with challenges and setbacks because they know they have family support.

Strong families generally have a few things in common:

- warmth, care and positive attention
- good communication
- a predictable family environment
- connections to other people outside the family

Here are some suggestions for creating warmth, care and positive attention in your family:

- Tell your children you love them, and look for opportunities to tell them you're proud of them.
- Smile and look into your children's eyes when you talk to them.
- Show physical affection when you can.
- Look out for opportunities to <u>praise and encourage</u> the people in your family when they do something well or something kind for others. For example, 'Harriet, thank you for unpacking the dishwasher this morning it was a big help'.
- Create opportunities for special one-on-one time, doing things you all enjoy. Why not make this special time part of your family routine?

MUSIG

In music, the students have been hard at work learning about musical styles, sound, rhythm, guitar and ukulele.

All students have been exploring some of the different music styles that exist in the world. Some students enjoyed the upbeat electric and disco styles, while others preferred the harsher sounds of rock, while the smoother melodies of country and blues where pleasant to some. This lead to some interesting discussions in class about which styles they liked and why.

The students have been learning how the guitar can be used to play musical notes. They have all flexed their creative muscles by successfully improvising a guitar melody to match a drum beat.

With ukuleles students have been learning about chords. They are discovering that chords are a series of notes played at the same time. All students have demonstrated growth in their ability to stay in time and change chords with greater speed.

We have also recently conducted a sound safari around the school. This required the students to visit various spots around the school and listen for all the different sounds they could hear. This lead to discussions of how various locations could all sound different.

As the year progresses the students will continue to progress with their musical knowledge of notes, rhythms, chords and different music styles. They will also continue to play guitar, ukulele, percussion instruments and also experience playing piano.




