Anzac Day - Dawn Service 2021

Students from St Brendan's woke up before sunrise to attend the dawn service. It was cold but we thought about the conditions the soldiers went through and how they had no source of heat like we do today. We stood and remembered our ancestors who fought to save our land.

They talked about the soldiers that risked their lives and could not see their families for a long time or ever again. We sang the national anthem with pride and listened to the Last Post with respect. Eight wreaths were laid during the ceremony but you could lay your own after. As school captains, Tommy and Eve laid the wreaths that represented St Brendan's.

All in all it was a wonderful experience.

Students from St Brendan's woke up at 5:30am to attend the dawn service. I tried to warm up with a hot chocolate. It didn't work. We went down to the dawn service and when I was cold I thought about how cold Uncle Percy would have been when he was fighting and how many other people had to do the same like my great grandfather McLean who died in WW2 and my grandfather Edwards who fought in the Australian Navy.

The last entries in Uncle Percy's journal which I have read were:

30th April, 1915

A quiet night and awful cold, got my pack and everything in it, a bullet right through it and spoilt the waterproof sheet. Got relieved from the trenches today and went down to the beach and dug ourselves in for a spell.

1st May, 1915

Had a good sleep last night and lay about all day, counted over 200 shrapnel shells burst inside an hour but nearly all out to sea and didn't do any damage.

2nd May, 1915

Back to trenches today left about 10am.

Diary of Private Graham - No 327 C Company, 8th Battalion.

Born 10th Feb, 1897 Died 2nd May, 1915.

Although it was freezing, early and I would have preferred sleeping in my Oodie in my bed, it gave me plenty of time to show my respect and to appreciate those who have fought and are still fighting for us. In my role as school captain with Eve I placed the wreath.
