Swimming



The cost for the Tuition Levy (including Stationery) for 2022 will be **\$180.00 per child.** You are required to pay for the Tuition Levy by **Friday, 4th February.** Please note the school will be open from Monday, 31st January. Please come and update medical forms and other relevant contact details to ensure all details are correct to commence the school year.

As the orders have been placed on a grade basis, your child's teacher will distribute the items within the first week of school. These items are basic requirements and are compulsory for each child.


