Second round Rapid Antigen Tests (RATS) are available for pick up from the school office. To support current COVIDSafe Measures, the Victorian Government has ordered 24 million Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) kits to continue surveillance testing of staff and students. Testing settings for all primary and secondary students and staff will remain in place until the end of Term 1 2022. It is recommended that students and staff undertake twice-weekly at-home testing.

In accordance with requirements from the Victorian Government, all staff and students in Grades 3 to 6 attending St Brendan's Catholic Primary School are required to wear a face mask when indoors, including when travelling to and from school on public transport, taxis or ride share vehicles and when attending Outside School Hours Care (OSHC) programs, unless a lawful exemption applies.

It is strongly recommended that students in Foundation to Grade 2 wear a face mask indoors at school or when attending OSHC programs.

Parents, guardians and carers are required to supply their child(ren) with an appropriate face mask that covers the nose and mouth. Appropriate face masks include single use face masks (commonly called surgical masks). Face shields, scarves or bandanas do not meet the requirements of an acceptable face mask.

All visitors, including parents, guardians, carers and children in Grade 3 and above must wear a face mask in all indoor locations at the school, unless an exemption applies.

While it has been a tough week at St Brendan's for staff and students, we have had success in other areas. COVID cases and forced isolation for staff and students has been extremely low so we have enjoyed a good run at teaching and learning. Children and teenagers learn by observing, listening, exploring, experimenting and asking questions.

Being interested, motivated and engaged in learning is important for children once they start school. It can also help if they understand why they're learning something.

And as your child gets older, your child will enjoy taking more responsibility for their learning and getting more involved in making decisions about learning and organising activities.

Your role in your child's learning

Even if you think you don't know much about learning and teaching, your child keeps learning from you over the years. And when your child goes to primary and then secondary school, you can help your child have a positive attitude to learning, just by being positive yourself.

I would just like to reiterate how important it is to prepare your child for the day. Please make sure your child knows the **pick-up arrangement for the end of each day**. If for some reason your circumstances change you need to let our office staff know before 12.00pm. Late notices can be disruptive to students and staff.

Parents, we still have **Rapid Antigen Tests** available at the office for those who require them. Twice weekly RAT testing is now in place for the remainder of the term. We will continue to advise families when tests are available.

Uniform Reminders:

JEWELLERY is restricted to the following - a wrist watch, no more than one matching pair of studs or sleepers, a religious medallion on a chain to be worn under clothing. Fashion jewellery, make-up and nail polish are not permitted.



HAIR is to be kept neat and tidy at all times. Hair longer than collar length is to be tied back from the face. Headband, hair ties, ribbons, scrunchies and clips must be blue, black or brown.

It is not appropriate for children to come to school with dyed or inappropriate hair styles as deemed by the Principal.

REMINDER: NO SMART WATCHES AND DEVICES AT SCHOOL

Smart watches that allow communication via SMS, email or phone call cannot be worn at school with the same rules applying as with a mobile phone.



At St Brendan's students may only bring mobile phones/devices/ SMART Watches to

school if there is a need for them to contact their parents either before arriving at school or in the afternoon after leaving school. Upon arrival at school the phone/ device/ SMART Watch is to be checked in at the school office where it will be turned off and kept securely for the day. Parents with an urgent need to be in contact with their child during the day should contact the school office and appropriate steps will be taken to pass on the message.

RECONCILIATION

The word *Reconciliation* has become synonymous with the efforts to bring healing to the Indigenous peoples; the original owners of this land, who have suffered greatly over the years. To Reconcile means to say sorry, to make atonement or to compensate for wrongs committed and to experience the healing power saying sorry and being forgiven can bring.

In the Catholic faith tradition and in other faith traditions, such as Greek Orthodox, Protestantism, Islam and Hinduism, owning up for your mistakes and saying sorry is an important way to live as a better person.

This term, several of our young Catholic students in Year Three will be celebrating

the Sacrament of Reconciliation, where they will take ownership of their faults, make amends and receive the grace of God's forgiveness.

The Sacrament will take place on Thursday 31st March. The first meeting, for parents only, will be held this week in the Hobby Room at 5pm.

Please contact Helen at school if your child is eligible for this Sacrament, but has received no notification.



Seasons For Growth 2022

Seasons for Growth is an innovative, evidence-based change, loss and grief education program that draws on the metaphor of the seasons to understand the experience of grief. It builds the knowledge and skills necessary to strengthen social and emotional wellbeing following significant loss by:

Exploring the impact of change and loss

Learning about effective ways to respond and adapt

Participants learn that they are not alone in their experience of change, loss and grief, and are able to build their communication, decision making and problem solving skills within the context of a safe and supportive peer group learning environment.

All Seasons for Growth programs are grounded in sound, person-centred educational principles.

As such, our programs have been shown to be a very effective education intervention. The programs do not provide counselling or psychotherapy.

The Program has a safe and engaging curriculum structure that incorporates a wide range of age-appropriate activities involving drawing, role-play, stories, discussion, playdough, music and journal activities.

The program includes eight weekly sessions, a final celebration session and two subsequent reconnector sessions (of about 40 minutes). Each weekly session explores a concept theme such as, Life is like the Seasons, Change is Part of Life, 'Valuing My Story, Caring for my Feelings, Making Good Choices.

The eight sessions will begin in Week 6 and continue for 8-10 weeks.
