#### What have we been up to in Out of School Hours Care (OSHC)??

On Monday the 9<sup>th</sup> May the Children attended the Dinosaur and fossil Museum at the East Gippsland Shire library that was run by the Melbourne Museum. The children were able to touch real fossils and see the replicas of large dinosaur bones. This was great timing as the children have been making fossils and learning about Dinosaurs.

From the 2<sup>nd</sup> to the 6<sup>th</sup> of May the children engaged in a fundraiser for 'Open Reading Doors' ran by the Literacy foundation. All money raised was donated to Indigenous communities to help them have books within their education settings. Here at OSHC we were donated LOTS of books so thought this would be a great way for children to help the broader community and fellow students across Australia. Our goal was \$98 but we ended up raising \$108! The children were extremely proud of their achievements!

The world around us has been another focus this term so far, the children have been creating landmarks in craft, researching Australian Animals and viewing pictures of what other schools look like in remote Australia and other countries. We are currently in the process of connecting with a childcare centre/school in Yuendumu to engage in pen pals. This will allow the children to see what other schools are like in the Middle of Australia.

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and St Brendan's is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 2nd September 2022.


Children from Foundation to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.
