

School TV – Managing Screen time

"Parents have an important part to play in role modelling a positive approach to using screens and assisting young people to navigate the content they watch." Dr Michael Carr-Gregg



Many parents have reported excessive screen time as the number one health concern affecting kids, especially now in the hyperconnected world we live in. The World Health Organisation (WHO) recommends that there should be no screen time at all for children under two, less than an hour a day for children aged from two to five, and less than two hours for five to 17 year olds. However, these guidelines have been disputed by experts and often ignored by families. Parents must play an important role in modelling a positive approach to using screens, and assisting children to navigate the content they access.

Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and St Brendan's is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved
- the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 2nd September 2022.

Children from Foundation to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.

Matilda: The spaghetti was **hard**. It was cooked and it went soft. We made a picture, then the spaghetti went hard.









Brock: The spaghetti was hard. It kept **Snapping**. We cooked it and it was **bendy**. We glued a picture. When it dried, it went hard again.





Collaborative Conferences will be booked electronically using PAM.






Please login to PAM as normal and you will immediately see a screen including the Parent Interview short cut.
