Family Barbecue

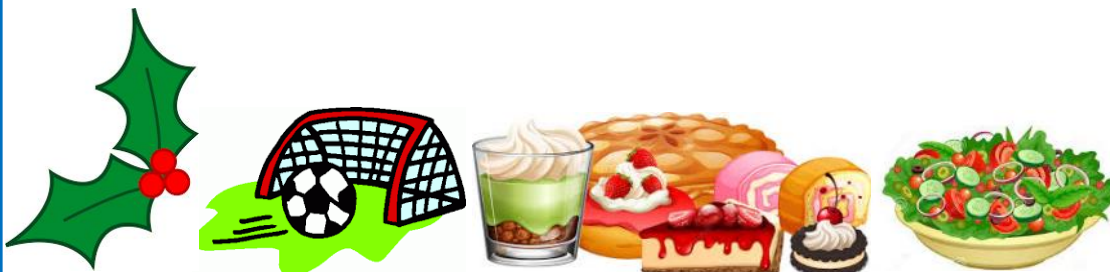

Dear Families and Friends,

Swimming lessons have been conducted over the last couple of weeks for students from foundation to year two. The development in the students' confidence and swimming technique over the fortnight is remarkable and the experience provides a great platform for entering the summer period.
