

We were celebrating the awesome year that we have had in 2022, learning about our Indigenous culture.

We made arts and crafts with family and friends, there was a heap of delicious food which Jane prepared, a big thank you to Jane.

We have learned a lot this year and the morning tea was a time for us to reflect on our culture and thank everyone who has helped us this year. Fi has been amazing, she has organised lots of activities and helped us along the way.



# Year 4 Maths Learning Reflections



Jasper- In maths I learnt about the denominator and numerator. The denominator is at the bottom and it means how much you have in the whole of the shape. The numerator is the top one and it means how much you have left or how much you took away. We were adding fractions together with the same denominator. We used pictures to show how much there was by shading the numbers of the numerator. We made chatterboxes that had fraction questions in it and we took turns to have a go at each other's questions. I now understand what the denominator and numerator are, fractions up to eighths and my brain clicked when I realised fractions can go really far.



Bella- Our learning intentions were to use decimals in numbers, on a number line and to do equations with decimal numbers. For one of the learning strategies there was a game that we played. Mr Hamer put a number under the eraser and we had to guess the number in 15 attempts with yes or no questions. Mr Hamer gave us a decimal number to make and we had to shade in the number that was given as a fraction and write it as a fraction. Sometimes he gave us a fraction to figure out as a decimal. We were asked to turn fractions into decimals and decimals into fractions. The biggest strategy that helped us was the sheets that had tenths and hundredths on it. I feel like I am successful because I know a lot more about decimals now and I feel like I can add and subtract decimals. I hope to learn how to do more equations with decimals without taking a long time.



Harry- Lately I have been learning about BIDMAS. BIDMAS stands for:

Brackets	Indices	Division
Multiplication	Addition	Subtraction

Learning BIDMAS has been really useful for when we have longer questions with more than one operation. An activity I really enjoyed was placing the operations in the correct spot to make the number sentence true. The other thing we have been doing is ratios. A ratio is a way we can compare two things such as for every 12 shirts, there are 6 jeans so the ratio would be 12:6 or to simplify it 2:1. To use ratios, some skills you need are: fractions, multiplication, division and more. I really enjoyed using the ratio tables to help me solve the questions. I enjoyed how this week we were given a challenge. It was really fun and I hope we can do it again.



# Year 4 Maths Learning Reflections



Benjamin- We were learning different strategies for solving addition and subtraction problems that weren't using fingers. We added the tens together and added the ones together. We used a hundreds chart to count from the first number to the second number and counted backwards to work out subtraction. I really loved adding the tens and ones because I found it the easiest and quickest for me.



Archer- This week we have been learning about ratios. Ratios are comparing one number to another. I used my multiplication knowledge to help me work out some ratio tables. We have been learning to do ratios with worded problems. Ratios can be used to compare two amounts such as lemon cordial to water. I worked out which one was stronger using a ratio table. I felt successful as I have learnt something that can help me in the years to come.



Lucas- This week in Maths we were learning addition and subtraction number sentences. Mrs Hawkins wrote down addition number sentences on the whiteboard and we used counting up or down and a hundreds chart to work out the answer. I used a ladder to help me count backwards by 2s. I learnt that 'equals' means 'the same as'. I think I did well on addition and subtraction number sentences and I feel more confident that I got it right.




