Help will be required on Wednesday, 29th March at 9am to wrap the Easter prizes.





FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. FORM LOCE! School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works white sports teach teamwork discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible fa to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid meant-tested concession card or are a temporary fuster parent, you may be eligible for CSEP. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expense relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.


