
RE: End of 2023 School Year

As the 2023 year comes to a close, we take a moment to reflect on the year that was, in particular the moments of success and joy. This year has certainly been one where we have regained a sense of what is normal. As we gain a working momentum, there is a sense that we are developing a stamina that enables us to achieve our potential.

Across St Brendan's Catholic Primary School there has been a real sense of calm. This is due to the manner in which our staff teach appropriate behaviour and provide a strong sense of expectation. In turn, our students know what respect looks like, sounds like and feels like. The result is that our classrooms and playgrounds are safe places for students to learn, have a go and not be inhibited by judgement or distraction. For this reality I would like to thank our staff for the effort they put in each day. The focus is always on improving the lives of our students. It is a culture I am very proud of.

Our junior school staff have been running the Little Learners Love Literacy program for a number of years now. That, alongside the regular teaching of literacy is providing some very pleasing results. This year's year three students out-performed the state of Victoria by an incredible 20 weeks in reading. We are also seeing these gains in our local data. It provides feedback that our strategies are working. We are also seeing students record results that are years above the mean, which proves that differentiation is apparent in our teaching methods.

Next Wednesday as the staff finish, we will farewell the wonderful Mr B. Lou Battista has had a positive influence on generations of students and staff of St Brendan's CPS for thirty-four years. Our community is so much richer for having worked alongside him. Lou's gift for teaching, leadership and his unique sense of humour will be missed next year. We can never replace Lou, but will remember him always. Happy retirement, Mr B!
