


We look forward to seeing everyone at the **first assembly** on **Friday**, **23 February** which will be hosted by the School Captains and House Captains.

Why Mandarin (Chinese)?

1. Mandarin is the most widely spoken language in the world.

14% of the world's population are speakers of Chinese. The top five Chinese speaking countries include China, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Singapore and the United States of America.

2. Chinese is no harder to learn than other languages.

There are no verb past/present/future, no plurals, no tenses, no subject-verb agreement and no conjunctions.

There are over 80,000 Chinese characters but generally only 3,500 are used in conversation.

3. Educational and Career possibilities.

Important business and economic partners to the US and the world.

China plays an important role in world affairs and further career opportunities.

4. Learn another culture, food and travel.



Curriculum

- Encompasses both language and culture components
- Aligns with the Australian Curriculum (Language and Intercultural Understanding).
 Also aligns with the national curricula in New Zealand and United Kingdom.
- The curriculum is broken down into four modules a year.
 - The first three modules introduce new content
 - The fourth module is an extension and/or introducing Chinese characters
- Involves development of :
- Spoken language (articulation: pronunciation and tone)
- Reading (pinyin and characters) Pinyin: is the standard system of Romanised spelling for transliterating Chinese
- Writing of characters and pinyin
- Cultural awareness (not assessed)



Year Level Language Focus: 2024

Time allocation: 50 minutes one day per week.

Foundation: Introductions, polite words, animals, foods, counting: numbers. Sentence starters: I like, I don't like, I have, I don't have. Verbs: eating.

Year 1 and 2: Introductions, instructional verbs, colours, family members, counting. Sentence starters: He/she likes, he/she doesn't like, I have, I don't have.

Year 3, 4 and 5* additional extension vocabulary: Family members, sporting hobbies, clothing, days of the week and going places. Sentence starters: I like, I don't like, I wear, Verbs: I can play, I can't play, I go.

Year 6: places, sports, telling time, locations, numbers 10-100, transportation and directional verbs.


