## **DAY IN FOUNDATION**







Dear Families and Friends,

The **State and National NAPLAN data** was released this week and after a long wait we were able to compare our progress against these measures. While our own school data indicated we would fare well, we were pleasantly surprised with what we discovered.

NAPLAN 2024 Year 3 Reading - St Brendan's was 37 weeks above the State mean.

NAPLAN 2024 Year 3 Numeracy - St Brendan's was 8 weeks above the State mean.

NAPLAN 2024 Year 3 Reading - St Brendan's was 17 weeks above the State mean.

NAPLAN 2024 Year 3 Reading - St Brendan's was equal with the State mean.

These were just some of the great results. I should indicate that 37 weeks is actually equal to a year of schooling so to be one year ahead of the state is a significant achievement. All areas of assessments indicate growth for our school. I hope you are feeling as proud as we are!

Recently, **Doug Doherty**, **(principal of Nagle College)** visited our school. Doug came, not only to speak to our year six cohort to prepare them for a potential transition to Nagle College, he was also keen to establish a better working relationship with or school. In particular, Doug wanted to find out how Nagle could better transition students from year six to seven. Leonie Morrison and I feel that the meeting was productive, and that Nagle are developing a clear picture of our students' needs.

#### What is body image? - <a href="https://raisingchildren.net.au/pre-teens">https://raisingchildren.net.au/pre-teens</a>

Your body image is how and what you think and feel about your body. It includes the picture of your body that you have in your mind, which might or might not match your body's actual shape and size.

A positive or **healthy body image** is feeling happy and satisfied with your body, as well as being comfortable with and accepting the way you look. A negative or **unhealthy body image** is feeling unhappy with the way you look. People who feel like this might want to change their body weight or shape. Your child needs your help to sort through and understand messages about their body.

Sometimes you can help just by actively listening to how your child is feeling about the physical changes of puberty. This means really paying attention to your child's concerns and showing that you care and are interested in what they're saying. If your child is feeling confused, you can reassure them that the changes are a natural part of growing up.

It's also good to talk with your child about **images on social and other media**. Some images set unrealistic ideals for pre-teens and teenagers. But you can help by explaining how the images are often digitally manipulated so that people look more 'beautiful' than they really are.

If your child isn't talking or opening up to you, they might like to talk with another trusted adult. They could also:

- contact an anonymous service like Kids Helpline phone **1800 551 800**
- use Kids Helpline web counselling or Kids Helpline email counselling services.

Regional's is on the 15th of October 2024 and it is going to be held at the Joe


Carmody Athletics Track in Newborough.

# Maths Chance







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**Collecting Students from School Grounds – Child Safety** As you would understand, child safety is the number one priority for schools. As circumstances evolve, we want to ensure we have the best possible practice in place. Please note the following requirements for collecting students at the end of the day.

# Collecting from the church gate - (New arrangements)

Students in years Foundation, One and Two will remain with their class teacher at the end of the day just outside their classroom. The church gates will be open at 3.15pm, at which time parents are required to enter the school grounds to collect their children from the class teachers. This action is in place to avoid situations where students leave the school grounds and run into the church gate car park area without an adult being present.

#### Collecting from the administration office

Please enter the gates and collect your child from the junior classroom area or your child from years Three to Six may meet you just inside the gates. Students are not to leave the grounds and cross the car park area without an adult walking with them.

If dropping students off in the morning, you must also walk them into school. Please do not use the disabled parking bay without permission to do so.

#### **Collecting from car line**

Typically, St Brendan's staff are there to organize students into cars at the end of the day. If you wish to park and collect your child, please use the crosswalk and an adult must walk with their child/ren. Drop off at the beginning of the day should take place at the bus stop area.






