Parents or cares of students diagnosed with Asthma, Allergy, Anaphylaxis, Diabetes and Epilepsy must also provide a personalised condition specific action plan completed and signed by their doctor.

When you have a strong and respectful partnership with your child's school and teachers, you're in a good position to **give them information to help your child get the most out of education**. You and your child's teachers can work together to support your child's learning, development and wellbeing. When everybody is working together in the best interests of your child, your child is likely to have **a positive attitude towards school** and experience other benefits too. These include:

- regular school attendance
- positive school results
- good social and relationship skills
- a sense of wellbeing
- school completion
- progression to post-secondary education like TAFE, university or an apprenticeship.

How to build a strong parent-school partnership

- You can build a parent-school partnership in several ways:
- Say hello to teachers and other staff at school pick-up and drop-off times.
- Go to parent-teacher interviews/collaborative conferences and parent meetings.
- Check the school website, noticeboard and emails regularly.
- Be involved and help out in the school community in whatever ways you can.
- Go to school performances, barbecues, cultural or music events, and parent seminars.
- Ask teachers for information or feedback about your child, and share your child's special events or achievements outside school.
- Learn more about the school by looking at its annual report, website, newsletters and so on.

Smoking Ceremony

The Smoking Ceremony was held on Tuesday, 3rd February.

As school captains, we all arrived at the Indigenous garden to meet Aunty Sandra and set up for the Smoking Ceremony. Aunty Sandra told us a bit about her Nation, her Elders and why the Smoking Ceremony is important. This is a tradition that our school has embraced.

Aunty Sandra's ancestors go back over 60,000 years and that at that time they ran this land we are on today - Gunaikurni Land.

At 9.20am all of the St Brendan's students and staff assembled around the Indigenous garden to participate in the Smoking Ceremony.

As leaders, we introduced Aunty Sandra to everyone. She then explained to the students what happens during a Smoking Ceremony and why and that this is her welcoming us to this land and wishing us well.

Aunty Sandra lit the dry gumleaves, she dipped them in water and then placed them on top of the fire to increase the smoke.

Once the smoke was prominent the year 6s led the procession around and through the smoke cleansing themselves as they went, acting as role models for the other year levels in the school.

We would like to thank Aunty Sandra for coming to St Brendan's to lead our smoking ceremony for 2026.

Thank you also to Mr Hamer, Fi and Emma for helping to organise this ceremony. We really appreciate your help.

Chinese: Mandarin

Huānyíng 歡迎 - Welcome to 2026!

Here at St. Brendans we do not underestimate the importance of learning a language. Today's students are growing up in an increasingly globalised world where second language is an immensely useful skill, which can provide them with opportunities throughout life.

It is proven that learning a second language can enhance listening skills and memory, improve the knowledge of one's own native language as well as foster positive attitudes towards other people and cultures.

This year in Chinese Mandarin class, students will continue to review phrases previously taught and learn new vocabulary to extend their oral language. Mandarin learning at St. Brendans involves a seven year developmental curriculum starting from Foundation.



The curriculum encompasses both language and culture components. Specifically, the curriculum is broken down into four modules each year. The first three modules present new content, whilst the fourth module consolidates the vocabulary learnt throughout the year. In the upper year levels, the understanding of Chinese characters are also introduced.

Each module involves the development of :

- Spoken language (articulation: pronunciation and tone)
- Reading (Pinyin and Characters) Pinyin: is the standard system of Romanised spelling for transliterating Chinese.
- Writing of Chinese characters and pinyin (middle and upper grades)
- Cultural awareness (not assessed).



Content taught:

Foundation: introductions, pets (animals), I have I don't have, numbers, items, I like, I don't like, fruit, counting using measure words - GE, eating, foods.

Year 1 and 2: introductions, drinks, first activity verbs, numbers, food (types of vegetables) measure words - GE, GEN, I have, I want.

Year 3 and 4: family members, verb: sports, clothing, colours, days of the week, attending and doing activities.

Year 5 and 6: places, locations, time and time phases, transport, higher numbers, verbs: sports, directional verbs.

A list of vocabulary words can be provided if you wish to practise Chinese at home.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's financial circumstances and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS and EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school excursions, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or support an out of home care student you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid directly to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is \$400 for all school students.

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments:** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances:** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

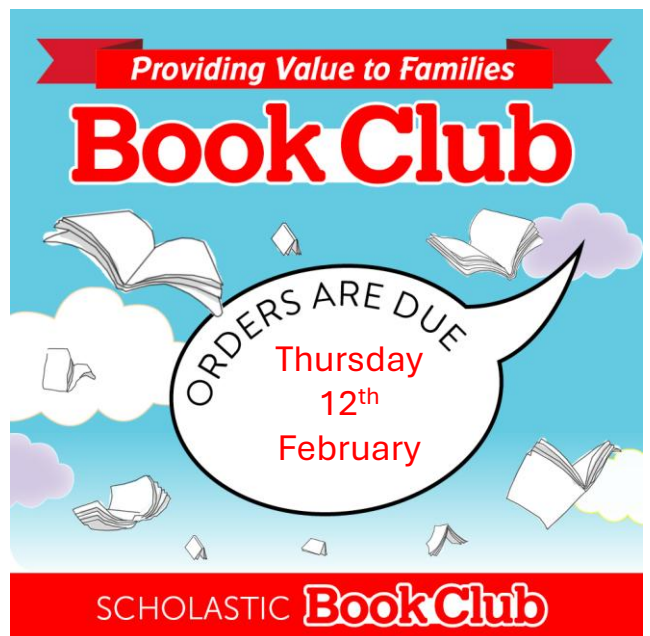
The best gift any parent can give a child is the love of books and the joy and benefits of independent reading for fun. Children who read at home, or are read to, have a head start on reading success in school.
